BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• Ten Big Ten schools were chosen for postseason bowl games this year, including four teams (Michigan, Ohio State, Penn State, Wisconsin) that earned berths in one of the six College Football Playoff bowls.

• Ohio State was selected to compete in the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz., on Dec. 31. The Buckeyes were ranked No. 3 by the College Football Playoff selection committee and will take on second-ranked Clemson. The winner of that semifinal will advance to the College Football Playoff National Championship against either No. 1 Alabama or No. 4 Washington on Jan. 9 at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa, Fla.

• Big Ten Champion Penn State will participate in the Rose Bowl Game Presented by Northwestern Mutual, while Michigan will play in the Capital One Orange Bowl and Wisconsin will compete in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, joining the Buckeyes as the Big Ten representatives in this year's College Football Playoff bowls. The Nittany Lions were ranked No. 5 by the College Football Playoff selection committee and will play No. 9 USC on Jan. 2 in Pasadena, Calif. The Wolverines were No. 6 and meet No. 11 Florida State on Dec. 30 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The Badgers were No. 8 and face No. 15 Western Michigan on Jan. 2 in Arlington, Texas.

• Penn State was crowned Big Ten Champion after its 38-31 win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game on Dec. 3 at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. It was the Nittany Lions' fourth Big Ten title and first since 2008.

• Michigan (10-2), Ohio State (11-1), Penn State (11-2) and Wisconsin (10-3) all have recorded at least 10 wins this season, the fifth time in conference history and second straight year that the Big Ten had four schools reach the 10-win mark prior to the postseason. A win by Nebraska (9-3) in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl would represent just the second time in Big Ten history the conference has had five 10-win programs in a single season, following last year's six 10-win teams.

• The Big Ten continues to feature the largest and most diverse postseason lineup in conference history, with six schools making their first appearance in their assigned bowl. Indiana, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern and Wisconsin will all make their first trip to their destinations. Ohio State will return to the Fiesta Bowl for the second straight year, while Iowa plays in the Outback Bowl for the first time since the 2013 season. Penn State will compete in the Rose Bowl Game for the first time since the 2008 campaign and Michigan will take part in the Orange Bowl for the first time since the 1999 season.

• Big Ten schools will once again take on one of the nation's toughest bowl lineups this postseason, facing eight teams that appear among the top 25 of the final College Football Playoff rankings, including four of the top 15. Third-ranked Ohio State squares off against second-ranked and ACC Champion Clemson in the Fiesta Bowl, fifth-ranked Penn State takes on ninth-ranked USC in the Rose Bowl Game and No. 6 Michigan faces No. 11 Florida State in the Orange Bowl. No. 8 Wisconsin will play 15th-ranked and MAC Champion Western Michigan in the Cotton Bowl, Iowa will take on No. 17 Florida in the Outback Bowl, Indiana meets No. 19 Utah in the Foster Farms Bowl, Nebraska matches up with No. 21 Tennessee in the Music City Bowl and Northwestern is preparing to square off with No. 23 Pitt in the Pinstripe Bowl.

The Big Ten will administer over \$200 million in direct financial support to more than 9,500 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on 350 teams in 42 different sports.

BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• Three Big Ten students and one position group took home national honors. Michigan's Jabrill Peppers earned the Lott IMPACT Trophy as the defensive impact player of the year and the Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player. Michigan's Jake Butt claimed the Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end and Ohio State's Pat Elflein earned the Rimington Trophy as the nation's best center. In addition, Iowa received the Joe Moore Award, given to the nation's top offensive line unit.

• Twenty-one conference standouts were named All-Americans, including 11 that earned first-team distinction from at least one organization. In addition, six Big Ten players were named consensus All-Americans, including three unanimous first-team honorees. Ohio State's Elflein and Malik Hooker, and Michigan's Peppers were each unanimous first-team All-Americans, while Michigan's Butt and Jourdan Lewis, and Wisconsin's Ryan Ramczyk earned consensus All-America status. • Four Big Ten students were named Academic All-Americans, giving the Big Ten 88 honorees in the past 12 seasons. The Academic All-America first-team

honorees from the Big Ten are Ohio State's Sam Hubbard and Penn State's Tyler Yajurian, who earned second-team honors last year. Northwestern's Austin Carr and Justin Jackson both earned Academic All-America second-team accolades.

• The Nov. 26 Michigan-Ohio State game on ABC earned a 10.4 overnight national rating, more than full three points better than the second-highest rated game of the season across all networks (7.0 by Notre Dame-Texas on ESPN on Labor Day Sunday). The 30-27 double-overtime thriller won by the Buckeyes was the fifth-largest non-bowl television audience in the past 25 years. In addition, this year's Michigan-Ohio State game was the highest-rated contest played at noon (ET) since at least 1991 and the highest-rated non-bowl game that did not feature a school ranked either No. 1 or No. 2.

• The Big Ten posted the second-highest single-season attendance total in conference history with 6,375,360 fans attending home games. This marks the fourth consecutive season and fifth time in six years that more than six million fans have attended Big Ten home football games.

Penn State quarterback Trace McSorley was chosen as the Grange-Griffin Most Valuable Player after completing 22 of 31 passes and setting Big Ten Championship Game records with 384 yards and four touchdowns. McSorley helped the Nittany Lions rally from a 21-point deficit to claim their fourth Big Ten Championship and earn a win in their inaugural Big Ten Championship Game appearance.

Michigan's McKenzie and Indiana's Green Honored with Big Ten Ford-Kinnick Leadership and Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Awards

Michigan's Reggie McKenzie was named this year's recipient of the Big Ten's Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award, while Indiana's Trent Green was chosen to receive the Big Ten's Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award, the conference announced on Nov. 22. These awards recognize Big Ten football students who have achieved success in the areas of leadership and humanitarianism following their academic and athletic careers at a Big Ten university.

McKenzie was a three-year letterwinner as an offensive guard at Michigan from 1968-71, collecting first-team All-Big Ten honors in 1970 and 1971 and going on to garner consensus All-America accolades in 1971. He helped the Wolverines reach the Rose Bowl twice (1970 and 1972) and earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Michigan in 1972. He also was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in 2002. McKenzie is the founder and driving force behind the Reggie McKenzie Foundation (RMF), an organization based in the Detroit metropolitan area. It is designed to stimulate a desire in children to achieve in school and everyday life through a focus on strong academics, civic responsibility and community service. In addition, the Foundation regularly recruits and places 15 youngsters ages 16-22 in summer employment opportunities, educating and training them for high-wage employment in the future. Past participants in RMF programming who have gone on to achieve success in their own right include NFL greats Jerome Bettis and Braylon Edwards. McKenzie has been recognized for his community contributions, not only with his foundation, but also with the Special Olympics and United Way. In 1999, he received the Ralph C. Wilson Distinguished Service Award in honor of his long and meritorious service to the Buffalo Bills organization.

Green also was a three-year letterwinner while playing quarterback at Indiana from 1988-92 and remains among the top 10 on 11 of the school's season and career passing charts. He also helped lead the Hoosiers to victories at the 1988 Liberty Bowl and 1991 Copper Bowl and earned his bachelor's degree in business-marketing from Indiana in 1992. Off the field, Green is chairman of the Trent Green Family Foundation, which was established in 1999 to support and develop family-focused programs that improve the health, wellness, education and future of children in need in the Kansas City metropolitan area. In May 2003, the Foundation announced its largest initiative to date, a five-year partnership with Phoenix Family to create the HIKE Reading Achievement Program, which offers expert instruction, academic support and educational resources to help instill the key to education for every child in a Phoenix Family community. Green was honored by his alma mater in 2004 when Indiana presented him with the Thomas Hart Benton Mural Medallion in recognition of Green's outstanding service and support to the school while sharing its values and goals.

Big Ten Announces 2016 All-Big Ten Teams and Individual Award Winners

The Big Ten announced the 2016 All-Big Ten teams and individual award winners on Nov. 29-30.

Wisconsin's Paul Chryst was named the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year, as voted on by coaches, while Penn State's James Franklin received the Dave McClain Coach of the Year, as chosen by a select media panel. Chryst guided the Badgers to a 10-3 record overall and 7-2 mark in conference play. Wisconsin won the Big Ten West Division to earn a Big Ten Championship Game berth. Chryst becomes the first Wisconsin mentor to earn Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year honors. Franklin led the Nittany Lions to the Big Ten Championship and an 11-2 overall record, including an 8-1 mark in Big Ten play. Penn State earned its first trip to the Big Ten Championship Game after winning a share of the East Division title and defeating co-divisional champion Ohio State in the regular season. Franklin becomes the first Penn State coach since Bill O'Brien in 2012 to earn Dave McClain Coach of the Year plaudits.

Penn State's Saquon Barkley earned Graham-George Offensive Player and Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year honors. He became the fourth Nittany Lion to claim Offensive Player of the Year plaudits and first since Michael Robinson in 2005. In addition, Barkley becomes the first Penn State player to earn the Running Back of the Year honor, which was introduced in 2011.

Ohio State's J.T. Barrett was named the Griese-Brees Quarterback of the Year for the second time, after also claiming the award as a freshman in 2014. A Buckeye signal caller has claimed Quarterback of the Year honors in four of the past six years after Braxton Miller also won the award in 2012 and 2013. Northwestern's Austin Carr earned Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year honors, becoming the first Wildcat to win the award.

Michigan's Jake Butt claimed the Kwalick-Clark Tight End of the Year honor for the second straight year, becoming the first repeat selection since the award's inception. Ohio State's Pat Elflein was named the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year, becoming the fifth Buckeye, and second straight, to claim the honor. Ohio State's Taylor Decker earned the nod in 2015.

Michigan's Jabrill Peppers earned Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year honors, Butkus-Fitzgerald Linebacker of the Year plaudits and Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year recognition. Peppers became the fourth Wolverine to claim Defensive Player of the Year honors and the first since Larry Foote in 2006. Peppers also became the second conference player to receive both Defensive Player and Linebacker of the Year honors, joining Wisconsin's Chris Borland in 2013. In addition, Peppers received the Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year award, which debuted in 2015.

Ohio State's Mike Weber was named the Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year, becoming the 10th Buckeye to earn the honor, and the first since Barrett in 2014. Michigan's Jourdan Lewis earned Tatum-Woodson Defensive Back of the Year honors, becoming the first Wolverine to claim the award since its inception in 2011. Ohio State's Tyquan Lewis secured the Buckeyes' third straight Smith-Brown Defensive Lineman of the Year nod after former standout Joey Bosa won the award in both 2014 and 2015.

Minnesota's Emmit Carpenter earned Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year accolades, becoming the first Gopher to win the award. Ohio State's Cameron Johnston became the first Buckeye to claim Eddleman-Fields Punter of the Year plaudits.

The offensive All-Big Ten teams were highlighted by four repeat selections to the first team in Indiana's Dan Feeney, Michigan's Butt and Ohio State's Barrett and Elflein. Michigan, Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin earned multiple selections to the offensive All-Big Ten first teams. Penn State's Barkley was a unanimous honoree as selected by the media contingent.

The defensive All-Big Ten teams were highlighted by four repeat selections to the first team, including Iowa's Desmond King, Michigan's Lewis and Peppers and Ohio State's Raekwon McMillan. Iowa, Michigan, Ohio State and Wisconsin earned multiple selections to the defensive All-Big Ten first teams.

The special teams All-Big Ten first-team recipients included Minnesota's Carpenter at kicker, Ohio State's Johnston at punter and Michigan's Peppers as the return specialist.

The Big Ten also recognized 14 Sportsmanship Award honorees. The students chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. These students must also be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 78 universities in the nation according to the 2014 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including six in the top 25.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,600 Academic All-Americans, including 48 honorees during the 2015-16 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively.

EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, nearly 1,400 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in more than 60 million homes across the United States and Canada. BTN2Go is BTN's digital extension, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. BTN Plus within BTN2Go streams hundreds of additional events each season.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 25 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, such as the Big Ten Career Expo, Saturday of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.
